- Next North Central Region Convention: As you know, because we do not have an affiliate host for next year's NCRAL conference, a conference committee was formed to develop and manage the conference. The committee has already developed a theme for the conference and has recruited a half dozen speakers. The conference theme is *First Light: New Frontiers, New People.* The committee's goal is to encourage attendance and recruitment of new members into amateur astronomy and celebrate the latest in new ideas and discoveries. The convention will be on April 25 & 26, and the location will be in the Minneapolis area. The convention committee has narrowed the list of possible conference locations to 3-4, which will be narrowed further, and a decision will be made in the next couple of weeks. The committee has also been working with members of the Minnesota Astronomical Society to conduct a star-BQ and observatory tour at their Eagle Lake Observatory on April 25. The conference continues April 26 with speakers, NCRAL business meeting, and a banquet at the conference center. Stay tuned for requests for help from the conference committee as planning continues.
