The committee has been working hard to plan a convention that will be "ASTRONOMICAL." They hope to have the 2025 website up and running soon. Watch for updates and keep these dates open on your calendars!" ASTROCON 2025 workshops are as follows:

- Astrophotography/Digital Imaging—Novice: This section provides help for those who are just getting into
  photography for the first time. It covers what equipment may be needed and basic photography techniques
  unique to astronomy.
- Astrophotography/Digital Imaging—Advanced: This course is for intermediate and advanced imagers who
  want to hone their skills and learn about the latest techniques and equipment.
- Observing: Personal Program/Journal: Set up your observing program, including Astronomical League Observing Programs, to consider. Starting and keeping your journal.
- Observing: Tips & Ideas/Eyepieces/Filters: Observing tips, including how best to use your eyes, what to wear, and equipment ideas. Understanding eyepiece selection. Using filters for visual and photographic work.
- o *Observing: Charts/Books/Observing Lists:* Using star charts (digital and paper) and reference books/star atlases. Creation of observing lists for different types of objects.
- Sketching: This workshop will give attendees hands-on experience with drawing what you see at the
  eyepiece.
